
## Can A Dead Book Live Again?

In the world of book publishing, books have a very short life. They begin life on the publisher's "front list", proudly proclaimed to the world as the next great literary masterpiece, infused with the publisher's and author's hope for a profitable return on their investment. As time goes on and popularity and profitability fade, the book is relegated to the "back-list" and then inevitably to that long list of books that are "out-of-print". The sad reality is that books whose value lies in the soundness and profitability of their content rather than in their economic potential usually meet the same fate as a one-time New York Times bestseller.

Everyday Publications operates on the premises that what we should be publishing is not what people want to read but what they need to read - books about the Book and its Author that are focused on communicating the truth of the message to the reader rather than on entertaining or impressing them. The Print-On-Demand (POD) technology used by Everyday Publications means that since books are stored digitally and produced electronically, production costs are minimized and books are not "front-listed", "back-listed", or ever need go out of print!

POD technology also means that books that were "out-of-print" can be brought back "into print"! "The Church of God - a symposium" had been out of print for many years but was resurrected in 2008, not because of its economic potential, but because of the timeless and profitable truth it contains. This book is a collection of excellent essays by Dr. James Naismith, J.M. Davies, James Gunn, David Boyd Long, Dr. Stephen S. Short, J. Boyd Nicholson, Sr., John Smart, E.W. Rogers, and Robert McClurkin. These brothers are all with the Lord now but they were mightily used of God, and will continue to be used by God, to build up and edify His Church. This classic volume is available by phone, email, or internet order for \$7.75 each.

Work is progressing on the "resurrection" of James Gunn's book, "Facts of the Christian Faith". This title has also been "out-of-print" for many years. However, we at Everyday Publications believe that books such as this - books that clearly and concisely explain the basic, core doctrines of Biblical Christianity - are needed more than ever before!

## Everyday Servants



## Quarterly Report Highlights

### Production

Production for the second quarter of the 2009 – 2010 (FY10) was down just 1.13% over the same period one year ago. We were encouraged to be able to maintain this level of production despite the necessity of shutting down the print shop during our mini renovation project.

### Distribution

Distribution for the second quarter of the 2009 – 2010 (FY10) was down 75.68% over the same period one year ago. This decrease is largely due to the fact that no containers were sent out this quarter whereas the second quarter of FY09 included the shipment of second Congo Container.

### Finances

“And He said to them, “When I sent you without money bag, knapsack, and sandals, did you lack anything?” So they said, “Nothing.” – Lk. 22: 35. Neither has the work of Everyday Publications or the workers He has called to labor there lacked for anything.

### Print Shop

The EPI Print Shop was closed for renovations from mid-January through mid-February. A wall was put up to separate the lunchroom/meeting area from the rest of the Print Shop enabling us to keep the machines running during breaks, team meetings, etc. Some electrical modifications were also completed in anticipation of the delivery of the new black & white printer sometime in the Spring.

### Projects

We have been very encouraged to receive several gifts designated for the purchase of the new black & white printer as well as for the reprinting of the Congo Swahili Bible and hymnbook. These gifts have been acknowledged with thanks and have been carefully set aside towards their intended use.

### New Title

In response to a request from the mission field, Everyday Publications is pleased to announce that it has published an excerpt from the Congo Swahili Bible. Yoane, the Gospel of John in Congo Swahili, is now available to those ministering in and to the people of the Democratic Republic of Congo.
