



The BIG Catch

And he saith unto them, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. -Matt. 4:19


And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid. From now on you will catch men." -Lk. 5:10

One of the biggest fish stories took place in early June, A.D. 33. As the sun began to set, the sky over the north end of the Sea of Galilee was probably a deep azure. Simon Peter went fishing with six others. All night the seven men worked the most likely holes. Results: nil.

When dawn broke, by simply dropping their net on the right side of the boat, they caught plenty: 153 to be exact. Not minnows, either. They were great fish. So great, in fact, that their nets began to break and their two little boats began to sink.

What made the difference? The Lord. It was when the fishermen took the Lord at His Word and moved at His command that blessing abounded. This true fish story gives us a picture of gospel blessing with God's help. The Master promised Peter that he would become a fisher of men, drawing them in with better nets (Jn. 6:44; 12:32). You'll recall just how true this was at the beginning of Peter's ministry when there were about three thousand souls saved on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2).

Let those who labor to win souls never lose sight of this divine principle: We are completely dependent on Him for catching any fish at all, whether the numbers be small or great. May we take His lead and move at His command.
