Tues. 1 “He who did not spare His own Son, but gave Him up for us all—how will He not also, along with Him, graciously give us all things? ~ In all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us,” Romans 8:32,37 NIV. As we look forward to a new year, we are assured that our Lord has taken care of all things! Hallelujah!

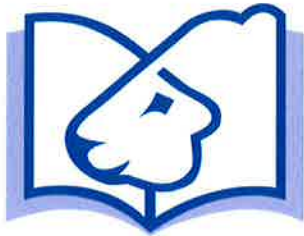
Mon. 28 Praise the Lord for His continued protection of the '310 Killaly Street' facility. As the winter moves forward, pray that all would be kept from harm.
