Sun. 1 “For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit. For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace. Because the carnal mind is enmity against God; for it is not subject to the law of God, nor indeed can be. So then, those who are in the flesh cannot please God,” Romans 8:5-8 NKJV.

Mon. 2 Praise the Lord that the skid of Emmaus correspondence courses in Creole (printed by EPI) and EPI books have arrived safely in Port-au-Prince, Haiti (PED April 16).

Tues. 3 “Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity,” Psalm 133:1 NKJV. Pray that the EPI workers will “dwell well” and “work well” together in the “bond of peace” for the Lord’s glory.

Wed. 4 The *Believers’ Bible Commentary - Vol. 1* in Congo Swahili is being distributed primarily to elders of assemblies and Bible School teachers in DR Congo. Pray that this more advanced teaching might be a great blessing to them and a valuable tool as they seek to pass on the precious truths to believers in the 220-plus assemblies. “And the things that you have heard from me among many witnesses, commit these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also,” 2 Tim. 2:2 NKJV.

Thurs. 5 Pray for wisdom for Executive Director Mark Beach as he deals with the daily responsibilities at EPI.

Fri. 6 Pray for Alma as she oversees the production of her book for the 100th anniversary of Chitokoloki Mission Station. Pray for guidance in all the details.

Sat. 7 “Remember the prisoners as if chained with them,” Hebrews 13:3 NKJV. Pray for those who work with prisoners “as if chained with them”. Pray for salvation and encouragement.

Sun. 8 From Oystein Mageroy, missionary in Norway: “Thank you so much for sending these books. We feel very privileged to be able to order books in such a small quantity of 300... Your work for the Lord is much appreciated.” Continue to pray regarding their recent loss due to fire (PED March 6).

Wed. 11 We were encouraged to receive a gift of £5,000 in April to help offset the costs of printing the large order for Angola. Praise the Lord for His provision for His work!

Thurs. 12 Praise the Lord for how He uses technology to reach many people around the world with the Gospel. Pray that the EPI web site would be a valuable tool in showing how EPI books can be used in ministry and in reaching the lost.

Fri. 13 “Continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving; meanwhile praying also for us, that God would open to us a door for the word, to speak the mystery of Christ,” Colossians 4:2,3 NKJV. Praise the Lord for our army of prayer partners who are earnest and vigilant in praying for “open doors”.
