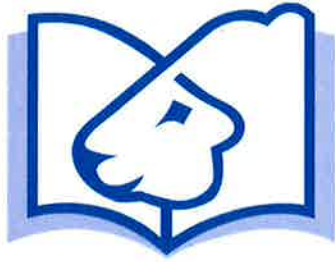

Thurs. 27 Pray for Noel’s ongoing health issues during this summer.

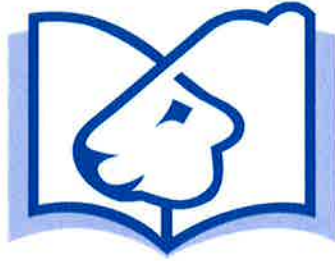
