## September 2010

**Wed. 1** “O LORD, You are my God. I will exalt You, I will praise Your name, for You have done wonderful things; Your counsels of old are faithfulness and truth,” Isaiah 25:1 NKJV. We say “Amen” to this and give all the praise to our God for all that He has done and is doing at EPI.

## October 2010

**Tues. 5** Also from Simeon: *“...your suggested idea about books for sale is a great one. This will help our assemblies in Burundi to start, for the first time, a Christian Bookstore. We would not have imagined that this will one day be possible.”* Pray for great blessing.

**Wed. 6** Praise the Lord for two generous bequests that will be used to further the Lord’s work here at EPI. We are humbled at how the Lord continues to provide.

**Thurs. 7** Alma has had some upgrades to her computer programs and it is proving challenging. Pray that she will adjust quickly and be able to carry on with her reformatting of Dr. Harlow’s commentary on Luke.

**Fri. 8** Praise the Lord for the 5840 books sent to prison ministries in July and August. Pray for those who deal with prisoners via letter, by marking exams, or in personal visits. Pray that the Word of God will change lives.

**Sat. 9** Pray that Noel will regain his strength after the long hot summer. Pray that he will have the required energy for all his daily tasks.
