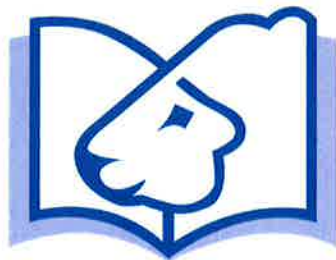

Sun. 1 “Trust in the LORD, and do good;... Delight yourself also in the LORD, and He shall give you the desires of your heart,” Psalm 37:3,4 NKJV. “For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also,” Matthew 6:21 NKJV.

Mon. 2 Pray for the Great Physician’s comfort for Gail Beach with her ongoing migraine headaches as well as His wisdom for all those ministering to her.

Tues. 3 Pray for Noel, Dwana, Estella, and Mildred Bondt as they continue the day-to-day routines of life, schooling, and growing in their faith. Pray for encouragement.

Wed. 4 Praise the Lord for the safe arrival of the three containers of Bibles, hymnbooks, and MacDonald commentaries to Bunia in NE DR Congo in July. Pray for their safe and effective distribution.

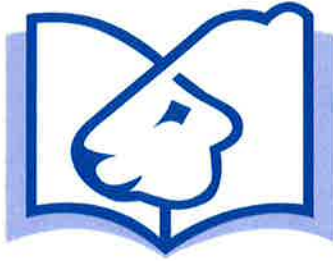
Fri. 27 Praise the Lord for the USPS M-bag service! It is still our most popular method of mailing books. It takes one to three months travel time and is most cost effective.

Thurs. 17 Pray that the Lord may prosper Sara as she reviews and copy edits Portuguese translations-in-hand in preparation for typesetting them. She started working on *King David* (1 & 2 Samuel) in August.

Fri. 18 Pray for strength, diligence, and accuracy for the translation teams involved in translating the remaining portion of volume 3 of the *Believer's Bible Commentary - N.T.* into Congo Swahili.

Sat. 19 From Harold MacDougall: "*Praise the Lord for the laminator that has proved to be a great answer to prayer.*"

Sun. 20 Commit us afresh today to the One who alone is able to prosper this ministry and use it for eternal blessing in the lives of those who receive the literature produced and sent forth from here.

Mon. 21 Praise the Lord for how He is using the EPI website to allow people access to EPI books. Many orders come for single books, such as our devotional titles or a newer book, *God of the Trees*.

Wed. 23 Praise the Lord for the 29 Spanish titles that have test booklets which make them useable as correspondence courses. However, only 7 of them have "expanded answer keys" giving the page and line numbers where the correct answer is found. This enhances feedback graders give to the student.

Thurs. 24 Pray for perseverance and diligence in developing more expanded answer keys to go with the Spanish titles that lack them.

Fri. 25 Pray for alertness for those who are preparing manuscripts for printing using computers. Pray for accuracy as they make the necessary corrections resulting from proofreading and that they will be alert to any "new" problems created by reflow of the text.

Sat. 26 Pray for an enthusiastic response to the EPI Resource Table at the *Southern Ontario Cooperative of ESL Ministries'* annual gathering today.
